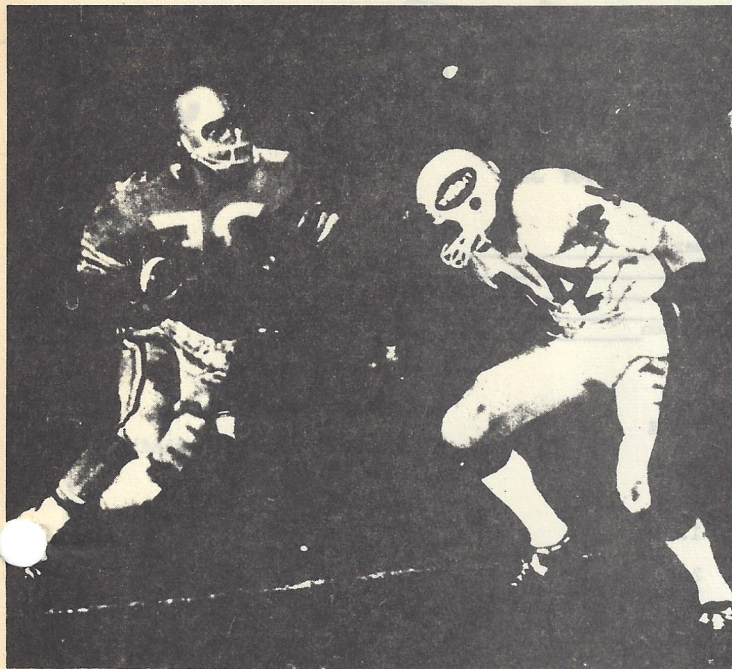

## Varsity Football Hosts Kennedy Scrimmage

The season is again upon us. Tonight, Coaches Ken McKenna and Harry Frum will unveil their Varsity football team for 1971, as they will host the newly formed Kennedy team in a scrimmage match beginning at 7:30 p.m.

Returning as this year's head signal caller will be junior Guy Benjamin. Benjamin, who started several games last season, should provide excellent throwing power if he is able to receive solid protection. Should Benjamin get the necessary protection, he will have an excellent receiving corps headed by split end Steve Berhman and flanker Gary Bernardi, and backed with tight ends Brad Rice and Jack Ernst. Rice will also be kicking.

Should the Vikings decide to play their game on the ground, they will have good runners with Mitch Drootin and Fernando Nunez. Drootin, one of last seasons celebrated "mini-backs" is only 5'7", but has proved himself quite effective as he posses good speed.

McKenna feels that his offense

is "ready", but will still have to improve. "Throwing and receiving the ball is our greatest strength at the moment" he stated, but he sees "trouble" is his team is unable to pass.

The defense is also going to be a major factor this year if the Vikes hope for a winning season but McKenna and Frum both view the situation as quite stable. Ed Milkovich and Don Richards head up the tackle positions, and will be accompanied by linebackers Dennis Shaw, Steve Haynes and Kevin Courter will be in at guard and Craig Hill and Tim Ashkar at defensive end.

As is every year, the MVL is one of the toughest in the city and for the Vikings to come out on top will be no easy task overcome. San Fernando and Van Nuys should be formidable opponents according to McKenna, as well as Granada Hills and Birmingham. If McKenna and Frum can pull their passing attack into form and back it with solid running and defensive performances, 1971 should prove to be an exciting season for the Vikings.

## Bond Money Needed For Repairs

"Money to rebuild structures constructed before the 1933 earthquake safety act and to repair school buildings that sustained damages in the February 9 earthquake will be taken from school funds unless the October 12 bond proposal passes," said Principal E. A. Miller Wednesday.

The 1971 School Bond proposal calls for the amount of 198,500,000 to be used to finance the replacement or rehabilitation of the 166 pre-1933 buildings and make reparations on other earthquake damaged structures.

According to Mr. Miller, "If the bond issue does not pass money to make the necessary cor-

rections will be drawn from funds allocated for special school programs." Mr. Miller further stated "that Monroe will be affected indirectly if such action is taken."

Commenting on the purpose of the bond proposal, School Superintendent William J. Jonston said, "The bonds will be used for that furtherance of school earthquake safety and will provide such additional facilities at those sites as required to meet current and future enrollment needs. At the completion of the work included in this Bond Proposal, all pre-1933 school buildings will have been strengthened or replaced."

## VAC Cards Go On Sale

Viking Activity Cards began their annual homeroom sales Wednesday. The price is \$6.00.

The card, which entitles the holder to discounts on various school activities throughout the year, will continue homeroom sales until October 1. All orders after that date must be made through the student store.

The card is good at most events including all football games except the milkbowl, all track meets, baseball and basketball games and specified dances.

This years VAC profits have been divided up with clubs and school organizations receiving about 8%, the student body receiving 30%, 15% going towards publications and about 40% going towards athletics.

Last year there were 1784 VAC's sold and with the new rise from \$1.50 to \$2.00 in general admission prices at the football games. This year's goal has been set at 2,000 sales.

## Valkyrie Reforms Suggested

Check-up sheets on more representative action from more steering committees are two of the reforms listed for Valkyrie in a Student Council report.

Valkyrie has been left with out a president due to the disqualification of Jeff Berkowitz who was elected last semester. Acting in his stead will be Brent Hunter, student body president, and Miguel Capote, DOCTRINE rep. The arrangement is only until a new student body vice president is elected.

Other reforms suggested for Valkyrie include questionnaires sent to teachers to check up on representatives, more effective use of agendas, screening of Student Council minutes by steering committees, a seating chart to tell who is there and who is not, simplified parliamentary rules, active involvement in VAC drive and the possible formation of steering sub-committees.

According to Brent Hunter student body president, Valkyrie cannot be run effectively without a good Vice President. He stressed the fact that 10th graders can also vote and urged active involvement.

## Bee Gridders Ready For Play

The Bees along with Varsity Gridders, will also be a power to be reckoned with a strong running offense, along with a solid defensive squad.

Running the offensive squad is quarterback Russ Johnson. During the season, Johnson will be unloading passes to ends Steve Keyser and Terry Brown.

Carrying the ball for the Vikes will be Tom Perkins and Bob Slate. The Vikings will be relying heavily upon these two men, as for they will be predominantly running team.

Highlighting the defensive squad will be linebackers Tom Derby, Hunter DeMarais and Ed MacIntosh. Expected to hold back goal attempts are defensive backs Jeff Chad, Drew Bridges and Mark Spitzer.

This year the Bee Gridders are expected to match last years performance.
