Benjamin Named Best

FOR THE FALL SEMESTER OF 1971-72 THE DOCTRINE STAFF HAS SELECTED VARSITY FOOTBALL'S GUY BENJAMIN AS ATHLETE OF THE SEMESTER. THE LANKY JUNIOR QUARTERBACK, A FIRST TEAM ALL-CITY SELECTION, NARROWLY EDGED TEAMMATE DENNIS SHAW FOR THIS SEMESTER'S HONOR.

IN ADDITION TO THE TOP TEN INDIVIDUALS, A LIST OF TEN HONORABLE MENTION PLAYERS HAS ALSO BEEN SELECTED FOR THEIR OUTSTANDING ATHLETIC CONTRIBUTIONS DURING THE SEASON PAST.

GUY BENJAMIN

Guy Benjamin is truly an exceptional quarterback. His poise, aggressiveness and most important of all his outstanding athletic ability has made him the Fall '71 selection for the DOCTRINE ATHLETE of the SEMESTER award.

A first team All-City selection, first team All-Valley and a first team All-MVL choice is only a sampling of his many awards and honors.

Benjamin, the Valley's top passer, and among the top three in the City, completed 140 of 275 aerials for 1812 yards which included 17 touchdown strikes, for a 51% average. He was intercepted 15 times while guiding his team to a 10-2 seasonal record.

His finest moment of the past season came on November 27, when he led his squad to an unbelievable 15-13 upset victory over Fremont. His last minute desperation drive set up a crucial Brad Rice field goal to secure the Vikes a semi-final competition position in the City Finals.

DENNIS SHAW

First team All-City, first team All-SFV, first team All-Mid Valley League and San Fernando Valley's "Lineman of the Year." Dennis Shaw's record speaks for itself.

Selected as this semester's second best athlete, Shaw, a stocky 5'9 185 lb. senior middle linebacker will long be remembered as one of, if not the best in Monroe's history.

A second year letterman and varsity co-captain, Shaw's brutal performances was the guiding light in the Viking defensive attack which allowed only a meager 11.1 points per game.

His head spearing stops combined with truculent body benders made him a player to be reckoned with, despite his size. An exceptional performance was his Rose Bowl spectacular in which he and his counterparts turned away a highly regarded Bell squad with a 12-0 shutout over the previously unbeaten Eastern League Champions.

They don't make many Dennis Shaw's these days, but when they do, you can be sure it's one of the best!

STEVE BERGMAN

Tying for third place on this year's DOCTRINE poll is speedy split end Steve Bergman.

Bergman, also a first team All-City selection as well as first team All-SFV and first team All-MVL is without question the finest receiver in Monroe history. His exceptionally quick hands combined with his lightning fast speed made him the Valley's leading receiver and one of the City's best.

He season totals show 54 receptions for 748 yards (13.8 average) in 11 games which includes seven touchdowns.

MARK HILTON

Placing in a tie for third with Bergman this semester is Cross-Country league champion, Mark Hilton.

Hilton, undoubtedly the best Vike spiker since Neil Bernstein also captured sixth place in City Finals, while also helping the entire Vike squad take a sixth place finish in final competition.

Taking charge during the final league meeting against the eventual City Champion Granada Hills squad, Hilton never let up as he led his squad up to and including the championship.

BOB SLATER

Grabbing the fifth position for outstanding athlete is Mid-Valley Player of the Year, Bob Slater.

After the loss of Kirk Miller last year, Slater was forced to move from an All-League Defensive Halfback in his junior year where he performed outstanding, surpassing Miller to gain 1350 yards rushing while putting to-

gether 14 touchdowns along with 6 two points conversions, while earning a Varsity letter from his outstanding playoff performance.

MITCH DROOTIN

Selected as the sixth best athlete of the semester is full-back Mitch Drootin.

The stocky two-year varsity letterman averaged an amazing 5.1 yards per carry and led the way for Vike cohorts with an outstanding job of blocking.

Overshadowed most of the season by halfback Fernando Nunez, Drootin caught the crowd's eye with a sensational game against the Fremont Pathfinders where he made key runs of 21 and 30 yards to lead the Vikes to victory.

It can truly be stated that if it weren't for the 5'8, 195 lb. Drootin, Monroe's grid chances would have seriously been hindered and a Mid-Valley League Crown would have been more of a dream than a reality.

TOM DERBY

Shocking all opposing players as well as spectators this year, was defensive end Tom Derby.

Derby, always coming up with the key defensive play, was selected as Best Defensive Lineman of the Year as well as this semester's seventh athlete, tying with Richard Nance.

Along with Derby's speed, he was regarded as the Bee squad's toughest lineman. Coach Richard Raymond described Derby as follows: "Derby is just one of those guys. He loves to hit and he does it well. Next year Derby will surely be a star on the varsity squad."

RICHARD NANCE

Hard running Varsity roadrunner Richard Nance has tied with Derby for this semester's seventh place athlete.

Nance, competing in the varsity race and only a sophomore, took second place in league finals and captured tenth place in city finals. Nance led the Varsity Cross-Country team for most of the season until Mark Hilton returned to his previous years form and thus proceeded to earn Monroe a reputation of one of the most feared schools on spikes.

CRAIG HILL

They always say that "It's what's up front that counts!"

Who could ask for a better one than this semester's ninth best athlete, Craig Hill.

Hill, a brutal 5'11, 195 lb. tackle, was the spark in the ever so vital Viking offensive line. His body busting blocks combined with his spine-stinging stops earned him numerous awards which included first team All-MVL, second team All-SFV, and third team All-City.

One of two three year Varsity letterman, Hill, along with counterparts Tom Porter, Kevin Courter, Steve Haynes and Brian Griset, made up the so terribly underrated offensive line which performed with unsurpassed excellence in turning back opposing defensive units.

AL HYAM

Al Hyam is the tenth choice on this semester's totem-pole as he led the Vike cagers to their on-

ly league victory thus far as he turned in a scorching 26 point performance.

Hyam, who has contributed 103 points to date, is also credited with 39 assists and has grabbed 27 rebounds, and exceptional high statistic for a guard.
