A student and faculty committee was formed and Jeff Berkowitz was removed from the office of Student Union Representative in action taken this week by Student Council.

The student-faculty committee officially met last Monday to discuss additions and modifications to the Student Bill of Rights added to the Student Body Constitution last semester. The administration asked for more specific regulations regarding the new bill stating that in its present form it is too vague. Next Monday, a final draft for modifications will be drawn up.

Guest Passes to Help Outsiders at Activities

The guest pass does not alter the price of the activity, however, if the guest is a high school student and has ID, his host or hostess may purchase the guests ticket for the football games at the student store for the student price. This does not go for graduated or college students. Everybody must pay general admission if they buy their tickets at the gate.

Senior privilege card may be used as a guest pass for all activities except football games.

A host must have his ID with him at all times. Mrs. Beattie stressed the fact that a student must have his ID with him at all activities at all times, regardless of whether he or she is a letterman, on drill team, or a student.

This semester student council has played an endless game of musical chairs with the offices in student council that have been vacated by impeachments, removals, resignations, and refusals to accept the responsibilities so well understood at the time of the elections.

Since the removal of Jeff Berkowitz from the office of vice-president last semester by an overpowering administration, council has suffered a great schism. The removal was not well accepted by the student body, even though many of the opponents to the action agreed that Jeff had displayed "conduct unbecoming to a student body officer."

Following Jeff's removal came the not-so-publicized removal of Nino King from the office of Commissioner of Elections, again for conduct unbecoming. The student council voted to remove him only because of pressure from the administration; it was a choice between letting the administration remove Nino or the student council. The council agreed that to avoid any more student - administration tension it would be wise to remove him by themselves.

Now that the puppet strings had been pulled, council set the scene for a continuing trend of other official changes. Bob Waskul was "appointed" to fill Nino's vacancy, an otherwise student body elected office, the reasoning being that we needed a commissioner of elections to run the election for the vacancy caused by Jeff's removal.

Meanwhile, Jeff Berkowitz was back on the scene taking the office of Student Union representative in a club election which he has confessed was rigged. Jeff went to work changing the policies of the Student Union on his own. A shocked Student Un-

ion met and elected another representative to council, leaving Jeff out in the cold again. The club not removed him, would have resigned from the office by himself because of pressure from the council brought on by his rigging of the election.

Another interesting move taken by council is the permitting of Marvin Moskowitz to serve in the place of Gary Mason, student body elected Boy's League President. In spite of the fact that such an action is in violation of the student body constitution, no action has been taken.

A similar situation is the allowing of a representative to serve in the place of the President of CSF, Scott Hemphill, on council. This is also in violation of the constitution, but the council doesn't seem to care about officers scoffing off their official responsibilities.

The two causes of this schism are 1) the refusal of elected officers to accept responsibilities that they will know were part of the glory of being a student body officer and 2) administration tampering with the student government.

It is up to us, as students, to say "stop" to all this garbage and force council to put some respect on the student body's opinion which is given each time an election is held.

Childhood Education Class Trains Kindergarden Aides

The Childhood Education Aide program at Monroe is an occupational class, designed to train high school girls to become day care kindergarden aids.

This class is taught by Mrs. Mary Ferguson and Mrs. Maurene Rigby, and contains 22 girls. These girls were chosen on the basis of an application and a screening. After completing this annual course, these girls will meet the State requirement for a day-care kindergarden aide permit.

During the fall semester the class will consist of field trips and on the job training as aides in kindergarden and first grade. The girls will learn how to assist teachers in teaching motor and communication skills, art and music to the young children.

A room on the Monroe campus

is now being prepared for use as a day care center next semester. The equipment for the center is paid for with federal funds. There will be a play area, with hard and soft surfaces, and part of the agricultural area will be used. The day care center will be open for 2 hours a day, every Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday for children between the ages of 3 and 5.

Monroe is not the first high school to have a day care center on campus. Polytechnic and Chatsworth also have day care centers on campus.

"This is one of the great-career opportunities for young women," stated Mrs. Ferguson, Childhood Education Aide class, teacher. "There has been great interest shown by both students at Monroe and parents in the community."
