

Jay Vees Topple Brave

Monroe's Jayvee Hardballers once more proved that they were a power to be recognized, by easily taking the Braves from Birmingham, 14-5 to give them their twelfth win of the season.

Jayvee pitcher, Guy Benjamin earned his fifth win of the season, to put his record at 5-1. He accounted for 7 strikeouts while appearing on the mound four innings.

The Vikings' first four runs came as soon as they came to bat in the bottom of the first.

It started when leadoff man, Bob Slater went to first, via a base on balls. Brad Rice also walked, setting up a key situation for Tim Wilkins who ripped a base hit, moving Slater to third and with bases loaded, the Braves tried the pickoff play to get Slater, however they overthrew the ball, causing Slater to score.

Rich Guerra kept the pace, as he powdered a long deep drive into center and hitting Wilkins and Rice in.

Benjamin kept the Braves silent in every inning except for the first and the seventh.

Jim Nott opened the top of the first with a hard line drive into right field, which earned him a triple. Lazlo Finklestein bombed a grounder to get to first, scoring Nott. Finklestein stole second and third. Jeff Quintail went to first, when he was struck by a pitch, setting the mood for Jack Hospodar, who ripped a hard grounder into shallow left, scoring Finklestein and Quintail, which gave the Braves their only runs of the game until the top of the seventh in which they were only able to produce one run, giving the win to the Vikings.

Unbeatable Vikings Victorious Again

The Milwaukee Bucks are almost impossible to beat, and so their fans have come to expect victory every time they step onto the court. The same measure of success has been achieved by the Monroe Vikings of the Mid-Valley League, as they had won 33 straight MVL contests going into Tuesday's game with Birmingham.

And sure enough, coach Denny Holt's squad blasted the Braves 8-2, recording their thirteenth straight victory this season.

Trailing 1-0 in the second, the Vikings scored a pair to get on top. Craig Cacek led off with a fly ball to right, but Birmingham's Jay Lustig couldn't handle it and was charged with a two-base error as Cacek sped into second. With the Brave infield

expecting a bunt, Jerry McArthur punched a grounder through the right side for a single, and the Viking leftfielder took second when centerfielder Andy Schneider bobbled the ball.

Gerard Grandi followed with a fine bunt down the third base line, and Brave pitcher Jeff Richman hurried his throw the first, causing the ball to sail in to right field, allowing McArthur to score and Grandi to take second, and the Vikings were suddenly on top 2-1.

Skip Willis led off the third with a looping double to left, and Rich Reinhardt followed with a repeat performance of Grandi's bunt, with Willis scoring from second on the play, making it 3-1 Monroe.

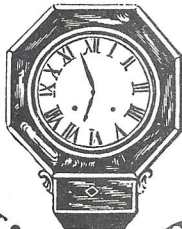

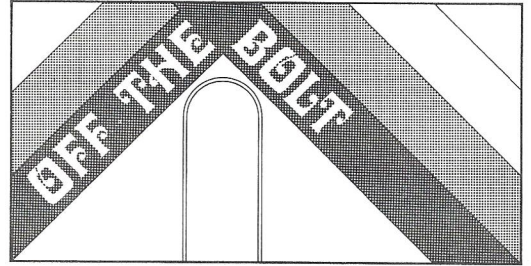

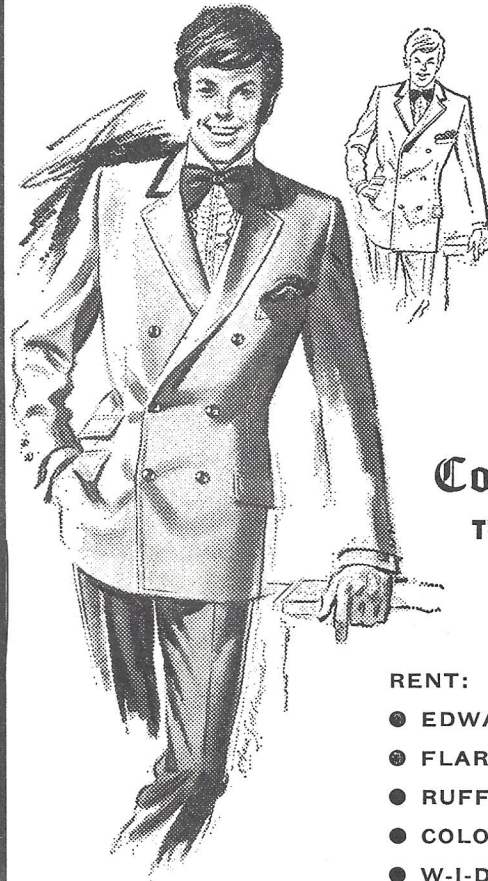
